These life-stage specific, education programs create a pipeline of opportunities and activities for students from eight years of age to 18 years old.

In close mutual partnership with local industry, including defence prime contractors, multinationals and SMEs, students are immersed in industry focused and designed curriculum as well as professional placements and work experience.

Appointment of Chair

By the end of March, RDA Hunter had received the welcome news that Mr John Turner had been appointed as Chairman of RDA Hunter by Federal Minister for Regional Development and Territories, the Hon Dr John McVeigh MP.

ME Program

STEM Workforce Initiative Manager, RDA Hunter Chair & Deputy Chair travelled to Canberra to meet with the Department of Defence, funding partner for the ME Program, to discuss the achievements and progress of the program throughout the funding period.

Constitution

A new constitution was adopted by RDA Hunter to align its purpose with the charter and requirements of our funding agreement with the Australian Government.

This has been an outstanding success lifting participant rates in these areas significantly and developing a skilled work force not only for defence industries but also for like industries, particularly advanced manufacturing. RDA Hunter's STEM Workforce Initiative starts at primary school, with robotics and coding, through to secondary schools with career pathways and curriculum enhancement, and support programs for entry to VET, internships, apprenticeships and university. RDA Hunter is actively seeking funding to continue and expand this Initiative.
